FAQ's on the Stew Challenge:

- Q: Is this invitation considered a "gift" to legislators and does it have to be reported on the Ethics Commission report?
- A: NO! BIA-Hawaii inquired with the Ethics Commission as to whether or not the acceptance of the invitation meant that a gift was made to the Legislators and if they had to report it. The Ethics Commission said that this would be considered "goodwill lobbying" on the part of BIA-Hawai (not a gift) and that only BIA needed to report the total cost of food and beverages for all legislators and their staffs. Legislators do not have to report anything since the cost of the food and beverage would be much less than \$25 per person.
- Q: Does this mean I have to make stew?
- A: No, BIA recruits teams to prepare and present their entries at the stew challenge.
- Q: How many stew teams are there?
- A: BIA-Hawaii usually has between 12 and 15 stew teams but can accommodate more entries. Each team will serve small cups of their stew for sampling by guests. You can have more servings of your favorite stew.
- Q: Is there a competition for the best tasting stew? Who judges the stews?
- A: Yes, there is a competition for the stews with monetary prizes for the first three winners. There is also a prize for the "people's choice". BIA-Hawaii invites judges who may be professional chefs, food editors, people in charge of food service for a variety of organizations or anyone we know to be a true love of good food to be our judges.
- Q: Can only BIA-Hawaii members enter the contest?
- A: No, in 2008 the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations' Community Services office entered a unique stew. If you know of a group or office that wants to enter their famous stew, please let us know.

In connection with Pacific Resource Partnership's (PRP) recent invitation to you for the reception for U.S. Secretary of Transportation Ray La Hood, on Tuesday, March 22, 2011 at the Hilton Hawaiian Village Beach Resort & Spa, and based on several inquiries we have received from legislators, we had our legal counsel contact the State Ethics Commission's Executive Director. Mr. Kondo, who graciously took the time to discuss this matter on short notice, informed our legal counsel that he believed that the State Ethics Code would only permit legislators who fell within a "protocol" designation to attend without payment, unless a specific legislator could establish a State benefit. He stated he was willing to discuss this matter with individual legislators.

Although we wanted to provide the unique opportunity to hear a ranking U.S. Government official to all legislators without charge, PRP has been advised that this may raise issues with H.R.S. Section 84-11. To assist you in participating at this event, PRP has determined that the fair value for the cost of food at the reception is \$36.75, and if this was paid by you to PRP, we believe your attendance would not raise issues with H.R.S. Section 84-11 since you would not be receiving a "gift."

We regret this unfortunate situation but PRP believes that this option will nullify the perception issue that was highlighted in recent legislative hearings.




